Article 4, Section 11-20 Protected Wildlife Species page 11 of 59

After (1) statement, insert this statement

- (3) "Prior to vegetation or underbrush removal during land clearing within a designated protected species' habitat zone, shall first require approval from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and/or US Fish and Wildlife Service, in writing placed on record with the City of North Port. However, no land clearing inside protected zones shall be conducted within the species' habitat zone during nesting season.
- (4) According to US Fish and Wildlife, "if a lot is being cleared, and it has endangered species or endangered species' habitat on that property, the property owner may be in violation of the Endangered Species Act. Violations of the ESA, under 16 USC 1540, is a class "A" misdemeanor, punishable by one year in jail, and/or \$100,000 fine for individuals, or \$200,000 fine for Corporations." This restriction supersedes local policies.

(5) The City shall make every effort to maintain sustainability and a healthy

waterways systems/habitats for protected species listed in the Endangered Species Act, such as, but not limited to, the manatee, wood stork, Florida Scrub Jay and sandhill crane. To insure sustainable and healthy water systems/habitats, the Best Management Practices hall be followed as set forth by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services recommendations, such as, but not limited to, Nutrient management, Irrigation management, Water resource protection, to include implimentation of manual clearing of vegetation in waterways instead of herbicide treament. Change sentence of (1) (c) to read: "Projects shall include enhancement or restoration of native habitats, not required through permitting or regulation.
