ORDINANCE NO. 2023-\_\_\_

1 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, REPEALING CRITERIA RELATING 2 TO THE PLAYFUL CITY USA PROGRAM FROM THE PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY 3 BOARD POWERS AND DUTIES; AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, 4 FLORIDA, SECTION 4-162, REGARDING POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE NORTH PORT 5 PARKS AND RECREATIONAL ADVISORY BOARD; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING 6 FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND 7 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 8 9 WHEREAS, the Playful City USA program was offered through KABOOM!, a national non-profit, to 10 recognize and honor cities and towns that ensured kids in their communities, particularly kids from lowincome families, were getting the balanced and active play they need to thrive; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, on April 14, 2014, the City Commission adopted Ordinance No. 2014-14 establishing the Parks 14 and Recreation Advisory Board, including criteria for the Playful City USA program; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the City of North Port was recognized as a Playful City USA from 2010 through 2017; and 17 18 WHEREAS, KABOOM! discontinued the Playful City USA program in 2017, the standards for the program 19 are no longer followed, and the Commission has determined to remove reference to the program from 20 the City Code; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that these amendments serve the public health, safety, and welfare 23 of the citizens of the City of North Port, Florida. 24 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA: 26 27 **SECTION 1 – FINDINGS** 28 29 1.01 The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated in this ordinance by reference. 30 **SECTION 2 – ADOPTION** 31 32 33 2.01 Chapter 4 of the Code of the City of North Port, Florida is hereby amended as follows: 34 35 "Chapter 4 – BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

3.01 In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance, in whole or in part, the provisions of this ordinance will prevail to the extent of the conflict.

### **SECTION 4 – SEVERABILITY**

4.01 If a court of competent jurisdiction finds that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or provision of this ordinance is for any reason invalid or unconstitutional, that provision will be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance.
