7		<b>EAS</b> , Section 34-1 of the Code of the City of North Port, Florida outlines the authorized locations for	
8 9	the op	peration of mobile food vendors on City-owned property; and	
10	WHER	EAS, on April 7, 2023 the City reopened the Warm Mineral Springs Park and held an Experience	
11	Vintage Florida Welcome Back Celebration, allowing mobile food vendors to operate onsite at the Warm		
12	Mineral Springs Park; and

14	WHEREAS, the City received positive feedback from patrons and vendors using Warm Mineral Springs		
15	Park regarding the positive impact of having mobile food vendors at the location; and

17	WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to include the Warm Mineral Springs Park as an authorized		
18	location for the operation of mobile food vendors; and

20	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that these amendments serve the public health, safety, and welfare		
21	of the citizens of the City of North Port, Florida.

33		"Chapter 34 – LICENSES, PERMITS AND MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS REGULATIONS	

ARTICLE I. – IN GENERAL

Sec. 34-1. – Mobile food vendor.

(c) Location. A mobile food vendor is authorized to operate in the following locations:		
(1) City-owned property.		
a. Location. A mobile food vendor may operate on city-owned or public property and		
the total operation must be contained within the area designated for their operation		
by the city manager or designee:

<ol> <li>Dallas White Park, a maximum of four designated spaces;</li> </ol>		
2. The Garden of the Five Senses, a maximum of four designated spaces;		
2. The Garden of the Five Senses, a maximum of four designated spaces,		
3. Highland Ridge Park, a maximum of one designated space;		
5. Highland Mage Fank, a maximam of one designated space,		
4. City Center Green, a maximum of six designated spaces;		
5. Blue Ridge Park, a maximum of two designated spaces;		
6. McKibben Park, a maximum of two designated spaces; and		
7. Atwater Park, a maximum of two designated spaces near the splashpad, except		
during Little League games; <u>and</u>		
8. Warm Mineral Springs Park, a maximum of two designated spaces."		

#### **SECTION 3 – CONFLICTS**

3.01 In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance, in whole or in part, the provisions of this ordinance will prevail to the extent of the conflict.

#### **SECTION 4 – SEVERABILITY**

4.01 If a court of competent jurisdiction finds that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or provision of this ordinance is for any reason invalid or unconstitutional, that provision will be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance.

### **SECTION 5 – CODIFICATION**

5.01 In this ordinance, additions are shown as <u>underlined</u> and deletions as <u>strikethrough</u>. Any additional codification information and notations appear in *italics*. These editorial notations are not intended to appear in the codified text.

## **SECTION 6 – EFFECTIVE DATE**

6.01 This ordinance takes effect immediately upon adoption.
