SUBJECT: Item #110: Mobility Study

DATE: August 1, 2022

During the City Commission Workshop on April 4, 2022, the Commission provided consensus to move forward with Scenario 2, which does not include the area east of Toledo Blade, Price Boulevard widening project Phase III, and to implement one Citywide fee schedule based on the suggested mobility Fee rate for outside of Activity Centers. The Department of Public Works coordinated the review of the proposed Mobility Fee with Planning Division's staff who identified a requirement to amend the Transportation Element of the City's Comprehensive Plan to accommodate the Level of Service designations identified within the proposed Mobility and Connectivity Plan. A Legal Services Request has been submitted to evaluate timing for the adoption of the Mobility Fee contingent upon future Comprehensive Plan amendments.
