



North Port Facts

- Largest city in population and landmass in Sarasota County
- North Port-Bradenton-Sarasota Metropolitan Statistical Area
- 104.1 square miles with a portion of U.S. 41 and Interstate 75
- More than 96,000 current residents; 250,000 residents projected at full buildout assuming 4% annual growth rate
- More than 80 miles of freshwater canals, from which it draws its drinking water during certain parts of the year
- Home to the Myakka State Forest; North Port is the only city in the state with an entire state forest within its boundaries
- More than 800 miles of local roads
- Two high schools, three middle schools, seven elementary schools

2026 Federal Legislative Priorities

Infrastructure

SUPPORTS funding resources for infrastructure including:

- Construction of new I-75 interchanges in North Port and completion of I-75 full interchange at State Road 681
- Water quality improvements, stormwater management, providing of septic-to-sewer conversion incentives, testing and resiliency
- Broadband internet access for all

Mental health

SUPPORTS legislation that will provide funding for early intervention and treatment of mental health issues for all ages

Workforce housing

SUPPORTS initiatives and incentives to support and provide affordable workforce housing programs

Disaster recovery

SUPPORTS efforts to:

- Receive faster reimbursement from FEMA after disasters
- Allow 120 days for debris clearance fully reimbursed by FEMA

Emergency medical transportation

SUPPORTS increased Medicaid reimbursement funding for Public Emergency Medical Transportation
