Membership Requirements

It is preferred that a majority of the regular and alternate members of the board shall be city residents. However, in cases where local residents are unable or unavailable to fill a specific category, applicants who are not city residents will be considered for membership. The community economic development advisory board shall consist of up to 11 regular members comprised of: (1) No more than two members from each of the following categories: a. Financial services; b. Real estate; and c. North Port resident. (2) No more than one member from each of the following categories: a. Medical and health care; b. Development, engineering, or planning; c. Higher education or unelected school board representative; d. Tourism, sports, or entertainment; e. Diversified light industrial/manufacturing; f. Public relations; and g. Land use attorney. An unelected Sarasota County representative may serve as an ex oficio nonvoting member.
