B. 23-0597

Discussion and Possible Direction Regarding the Draft of the Unified Land Development Code Chapter 3 - Zoning, Including Articles on Standard Districts, Village Districts, Activity Center Districts, Accessory Uses, Conditional Uses, and Specific Use Standards.

projections, property taxes, Unified Land Development Code (ULDC) rewrite, potential map errors and review process, zoning spacing reasoning, vacant lot impact, R-1 and MX-2 changes, property value, buffer requirements, fiscal impact analysis, Comprehensive Plan Amendment timeline, transportation modification, compatibility with Comprehensive Plan, impacts of proposed changes, population growth, millage rate, C zoning percentage relating to economic requires, questions submitted and feedback, direction required, and timeline.
