ORDINANCE NO. 2024-16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, SECTION 2.82. – QUASI-JUDICIAL MATTERS, TO PROVIDE FOR CONSISTENCY WITH THE UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance

This proposed ordinance would provide for consistency with the new Unified Land Development Code by the ULDC identifying new development application types and specifying application types that are subject to quasi-judicial proceedings.

The public purpose of this proposed ordinance is to serve the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the citizens of the City of North Port, Florida by ensuring that the process through which these development petition types are heard is clearly communicated to the citizens, property owners, and applicant for development approvals.

- 2. Estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City, if any, including:
