

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REPORT

Community Budget Input Process



BACKGROUND

The Finance Department in the City of North Port prepares the budget for the City annually on behalf of the City Manager and in cooperation with all departments. The mission of the Finance Department is to achieve community outcomes by preserving the financial integrity and fiscal management of the organization, while assuring the availability of funds to accomplish the City's goals.

The final millage rate and the budgets, including non-district, three districts, and capital improvement budget, are adopted by City Commission approved resolutions (via two public hearings in September).

Gathering community input during city budgeting is crucial. It ensures residents' priorities are heard, leading to a budget that better reflects community needs. This two-way street fosters trust and transparency, while residents gain a deeper understanding of financial constraints. By incorporating resident voices, city officials can make informed decisions about allocating resources for programs and services that truly matter to the people they serve.



HOW IS THE BUDGET DEVELOPED PRIOR TO ADOPTION?

- 1. The City Commission establishes budget priorities and goals based on the community's needs and desires.
- 2. Revenues are estimated to determine the approximate amount of financial resources that will be available to fund City operations.
- 3. Expenditure requests and forecasts are prepared by the various City departments and submitted to the City Manager for review.
- 4. The City Manager submits a recommended budget that reflects the City Commission's established priorities and goals.
- 5. The City Commission seeks additional public input and discusses the City Manager's Recommended Budget. Changes are proposed and approved at the budget workshops.
- 6. Changes are made according to the City Commission's recommendations and the Commission Tentative Budget is prepared for presentation at the public hearings in September.

INITIATIVE: COMMUNITY BUDGET INPUT

The City of North Port collects feedback annually through the Community Budget Input process. Community Conversations typically begin in the Spring, with the Assumptions, Projections and Priorities workshop immediately following. Feedback collected during that time is provided to City leadership and City Commissioners prior to the Budget workshops beginning in June. At any time of the year, citizens can view the City's budget online or at the City Clerk's office in City Hall. The public is a critical part of the City's budget process and is encouraged to attend meetings when the budget is discussed. If unable to attend in person, citizens can watch the budget workshops live or on the archived videos located on the City's website. The public is also invited to write, call, e-mail and visit with the City Commissioners during the fiscal year to discuss the budget.






Statement

Response: The City of North Port Toledo Blade Boulevard resurfacing was part of the annual Road Rehabilitation Project which consists of resurfacing, striping, curb repair and concrete turn lane maintenance, this was not a project to add bike lanes or additional traffic lanes.

Question: "Are there any talks about adding more bike lanes in NP?"

Response: The upcoming Price Boulevard Widening project between Toledo Blade Boulevard and Sumter Boulevard will consist of multimodal paths on both sides of the roadway, and the City of North Port also has an approved Mobility and Connectivity Plan that defines locations of future bike lanes as funding allows.

Thank you for your question and input. Please see the responses below from our Utilities Department:

The proposed 2025 Budget includes \$3,000,000 for the Neighborhood Expansion project and the current 2024 budget includes \$1,329,400 for the Neighborhood Expansion Project.

The City has included the need to provide service to the individual lots outside of the current service area in Master Planning dating back to 1992. In 2020 the City contracted with a consulting firm to perform a study for the water and wastewater expansion to provide service to platted lots in the City. The consultant prepared "sewershed" maps, preliminary cost estimates, and a recommended phasing plan. A map showing the "sewershed" areas is available on the City's website. In December 2020 the City Commission directed staff to move forward with design of one portion of a "sewershed" area called Blue-Salford North. The design of a portion of the first "sewershed" is 90% complete with construction anticipated to begin in 2025. The City is also evaluating properties in the other "sewersheds" to select the most appropriate properties to locate vacuum stations to prepare for future expansion areas.
