Dear Mayor White:

The Florida Department of Commerce (FloridaCommerce) has reviewed the proposed comprehensive plan amendment for the City of North Port (Amendment No. 24-01ESR) received on June 4, 2024. The review was completed under the expedited state review process. We have no comment on the proposed amendment.

The City should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment. In addition, the City is reminded that:

- Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., authorizes other reviewing agencies to provide comments directly to the City. If the City receives reviewing agency comments and they are not resolved, these comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.
- The second public hearing, which shall be a hearing on whether to adopt one or more comprehensive plan amendments, must be held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments or the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to FloridaCommerce and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(c)1., F.S.
- The adopted amendment must be transmitted to FloridaCommerce within ten working days
 after the second public hearing pursuant to 163.3184(3)(c)2., F.S. Under Section
 163.3184(3)(c)2. and 4., F.S., the amendment effective date is 31 days after FloridaCommerce
 notifies the City that the amendment package is complete or, if challenged, until it is found to be
 in compliance by FloridaCommerce or the Administration Commission.

The City of North Port Commission hereby transmits to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity Comprehensive Plan Amendment CPAL-24-057 for review and comment. The Planning and Zoning Advisory Board, acting as the City's Local Planning Agency, held a public hearing for the amendment on May 16, 2024, and recommended approval of the amendment. On May 28, 2024, the North Port City Commission held a public hearing, and approved the Comprehensive Plan Amendment for transmittal to the Florida Department of Commerce for review and comment with direction to incorporate the following revisions for the adoption hearing:

- Future Land Use Element: Remove all reference to 0.5 mile and 1.5 mile in medium and high-density corridor descriptions or to clarify intent and purpose of contiguity.
- Future Land Use Map. Change the parcel commonly referred to as Italy Avenue from medium density corridor designation to public/institutional designation.

CPAL-24-057 is an amendment to the City of North Port Comprehensive Plan, including amending the future land use element, repealing, and replacing the future land use map, and amending several other elements to provide for consistency between the comprehensive plan and the unified land development code, which the City is currently updating. This amendment is not applicable to an area of critical state concern.

All files of the transmittal package are submitted as pdf with this letter electronically through the submittal portal. By this letter, we certify that one copy of the transmittal materials has been submitted simultaneously to the following agencies:
