North Port Fire Training Tower

The fire training tower is a key component of a larger plan for the City's safety training complex. The new tower compliments the existing training track used by North Port Police. Future plans include a shoot house and classrooms.

The training tower is available for regional jurisdictions to use for their training needs.

Yorkshire Area

This area is outside the City's urban service boundary and borders Charlotte County to the east and south. Yorkshire Activity Center is a blank canvas ripe for commercial and industrial development.

Future plans include:

Interchange at I-75 and Raintree Interchange at I-75 and Yorkshire Solid waste transfer station

Soft opening – Spring 2023 Construction ongoing by the developers

Already Downtown Wellen is a flurry of activity for the residents of North Port and the region. Shopping, restaurants, play areas, boutiques, and the banquet hall compliment the diverse housing options within Wellen Park.

The downtown area's focal point is the 83 acre lake. There are activities, for all ages, including regular features such as cornhole, concerts, yoga, Zumba and running. The artwork and murals are quite exquisite.

The developer spent millions of dollars preserving and moving heritage oaks within the development area.

Opened in Spring 2019


Total Cost: \$75M

Cool Today Park (aka Braves stadium) is an economic driver for the entire region.

This project was a partnership with the State of Florida, Sarasota County, the West Villages Improvement District, the developer and the City of North Port. North Port contributed \$4.7M of surtax towards this project. Currently the stadium is owned by Sarasota County and they lease the facility to the Braves.

The Stadium is a replica of Truist Park, in Atlanta. This is a year-round facility. North Port will be hosting our 4th of July festivities, at this location, after a two year hiatus due to COVID.
