Provide immediate rescue and relief to the survivors of disaster within twenty-four hours of impact. Assist with long term recovery through financial assistance, debris clean-up, flood/water damage remediation, and distribution of supplies.

One Mission's focus area is within the state of Florida and determined upon the effects of a disaster, whether natural or manmade.

Indicators or methods used to measure impact?

One Mission staff and volunteers record data from our immediate response to an effected area and determined meals/water delivered and individual number of survivors rescued or extracted from the immediate area.

During long term recovery efforts, our team collects data on the type of relief provided (financial assistance, clean up, etc.) Data topics include household locations, individuals residing within the residence, assistance being received, and referrals to other non-profit organizations.

The collation of this data allows our teams to conduct post-season reviews to better prepare for future deployments or local responses.
