ORDINANCE NO. 2025-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA; AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE V., DIVISION 5. – POLICE OFFICERS' PENSIONS; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. <u>Summary of the proposed ordinance</u>

This proposed ordinance would amend the Code of the City of North Port Florida, Section 2-260 to reflect that effective October 1, 2024, members who elected to continue participation in the retirement system after the City joined FRS will receive a \$200 per-month benefit supplement, while those that elected to joint FRS are not eligible for this supplemental benefit. The proposed ordinance also amends Section 2-283 Regarding Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP) to provide for a 96 month DROP participation period.

The public purpose of this proposed ordinance is to amend the City Code so it is consistent with the collective bargaining agreement the City recently entered into with the Florida Police Benevolent Association.
