NORTH PORT CITY COMMISSION MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING MONDAY, APRIL 12, 2010

PRESENT:

Commissioner Garofalo, Chair; Commissioner Blucher, Vice-Chair; Commissioners Carusone, Jones, Treubert; Commission Intern Sturgis; City Manager Crowell; City Attorney Robinson; City Clerk Raimbeau; Deputy City Clerk Adkins; and Police Chief Lewis.

The North Port City Commission Regular Meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. in the City Chambers by Chair Garofalo.

The invocation was provided by Cantor Lyle Rockler, Religious Leader for Temple Beth El.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by the Commission.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Commissioner Blucher moved to approve the agenda, moving Item 7.B., to directly follow item 6.A.; seconded by Commissioner Jones. Motion carried unanimously.

1. INTRODUCTION OF NEW EMPLOYEES:

City Manager Crowell, Fire Chief Taaffe and Police Chief Lewis introduced the new employees respective to their departments.

2. **PROCLAMATIONS:**

A. <u>Proclamation: "Relay for Life Days April 24 and April 25." (Commissioner Garofalo, presenter)</u>

Commissioner Garofalo read the Proclamation into the record and presented it to a Member of the American Cancer Society.

B. <u>Proclamation: "40th Anniversary of Earth Day" April 22, 2010. (Commissioner Garofalo, presenter)</u>

Commissioner Garofalo read the proclamation into the record.

C. <u>Proclamation: "Recognizing North Port Chorale."</u> (Commissioner Garofalo, presenter)

Commissioner Garofalo read the proclamation into the record.

D. <u>Proclamation: "City of North Port Volunteer Month 2010."</u> (Commissioner Garofalo, presenter)

Commissioner Garofalo read the proclamation into the record.

5. CONSENT AGENDA:

- A. Approval of Minutes for the March 19, 2010 Commission Strategic Planning Workshop; March 20, 2010 Commission Strategic Planning Workshop; and the March 22, 2010 Commission Regular Meeting. (H. Raimbeau)
- B. <u>Approval of reappointment of John Nolan as a Regular Member to the Zoning Board of Appeals. (H. Raimbeau)</u>

- F. Approval of February 2010 Cash Receipts Summary. (T. Gould)
- G. Approval of two (2) five (5) year Service Agreements with SimplexGrinnell LP, for the annual testing and inspection of fire alarm detection systems, in an amount not to exceed \$3,797.00 for City Hall and an amount not to exceed \$2,179.00 for the Police Station. (L. Sperduto/S. Williams)
- H. Approval of Amendment #3 to Contract #2009-18 with Boran Craig Barber Engel Construction Co, Inc. in the amount of \$108,472 for landscaping, irrigation and site lighting to accommodate a future aquatic facility at Butler Park. (W. Ward / S. Borgsdorf)

J. Approval of the Settlement Agreement in the Code Enforcement Board matter of City of North Port v. Johnnie Kugel, which would require the Defendant to pay to the City the amount of \$6,734.30; would require the Defendant to bring the structure on the property up to code; and would require inspections performed and approved by the City by June 1, 2010. (R. Robinson)

Commissioner Blucher moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented; seconded by Commissioner Carusone. Motion carried unanimously.

6. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Ordinance No. 2010-22, first reading, amending North Port Code, Article VIII, Chapter 2 on Procurement providing for the purchase of flowers for employees who are sick or hospitalized, up to a limit of \$75.00 with department director's approval. (T. Gould)

Commissioner Carusone moved to read Ordinance No. 2010-22 by title only; seconded by Commissioner Treubert. Motion carried unanimously.

Subsequent to City Clerk Raimbeau reading Ordinance No. 2010-22 into the record by title only, Accounting Manager Lear provided a brief overview of the Ordinance, amending North Port Code, Article VIII, Chapter 2 on Procurement providing for the purchase of flowers for employees who are sick or hospitalized, up to a limit of \$75.00 with the department director's approval. There were no questions from the Commission and no public comment.

Commissioner Carusone moved to continue Ordinance No. 2010-22 to the April 26, 2010 Commission Regular Meeting for second reading; seconded by Commissioner Treubert. Motion carried unanimously.

7. GENERAL BUSINESS:

B. <u>Discussion, and possible action, regarding approval of a land sale and purchase from Sarasota Memorial Hospital to the West Villages Improvement District per the Sale & Purchase Agreement dated March 15, 2010. (S. Cullinan)</u>

City Planner Cullinan provided an overview of the request for approval of a land sale and purchase from Sarasota Memorial Hospital to the West Villages Improvement District. There were no questions from the Commission and there was no public comment.

Commissioner Blucher moved to approve a land sale and purchase from Sarasota Memorial Hospital to the West Villages Improvement District per the Sale & Purchase Agreement dated March 15, 2010; seconded by Commissioner Jones. Motion carried unanimously.

A. <u>Discussion, and possible action, regarding a City-wide Aquatic Facilities Master</u> Plan. (S. Borgsdorf/W. Ward

General Services Director Borgsdorf, Mark Hatchel and James Pankonin from Kimley-Horn, and Kevin Post from Counsilman & Hunsaker provided a PowerPoint Presentation of the Canal and Creek System Master Plan. Discussion ensued: (1) it was clarified that the Master Plan focuses on existing water structures and it is unlikely that any will be opened or removed; (2) sloped earth ramps vs. dock and pier

ramps; (3) restrictions on use of gas powered motors to certain areas north of Price Boulevard; (4) fishing pier at Blue Ridge Park design is currently in the CIP; (5) the cost for construction of the fishing pier at Blue Ridge Park is approximately \$50,000; (6) the majority of the design and engineering for the fishing pier will be done in house with a cost of approximately \$2,000 for the AutoCAD drawing; (7) it was suggested that inmates from State Prisons and County Jails be used to clear and clean the canals; (8) it was also suggested that the piers possibly be sponsored by community organizations and commercial corporations; (9) cost of Canoe Signs for the access points is estimated at \$2,500 per sign; (10) access for clearing and dredging may be problematic; (11) staff to research possibility of grants for funding; (12) will not require permits from the Army Corp of Engineers for the man-made canals. There was no public comment.

Commissioner Carusone moved to accept the Canal and Creek System Master Plan and move forward with phase I; seconded by Commissioner Blucher. Motion carried unanimously.

General Services Director Borgsdorf, Mark Hatchel and James Pankonin from Kimley-Horn, and Kevin Post from Counsilman & Hunsaker provided a PowerPoint Presentation of the Aquatics Facilities Master Plan. Discussion ensued: (1) it was noted that an outdoor pool and aquatic facility will operate approximately 150 days in summer season only; (2) use of pools for programs in winter; (3) Commissioner Blucher stated that he would prefer building lap pool first and phasing in the leisure facility; (4) Commissioner Jones, Blucher and Garofalo expressed concern regarding competition between the Aquatic Center and a future Water Park; (5) concern was expressed regarding lack of participation in funding by the Sarasota County School Board for construction of a pool for use by the North Port High School's Swim Team. Thereafter, public comment was held.

Commissioner Carusone moved to accept a medium aquatic facility at Butler Park and large spray ground at Atwater Park, staff to explore funding options; seconded by Commissioner Treubert. Motion carried on a (3 - 2) vote. Commissioner Blucher, Commissioner Jones dissenting for reasons stated above.

Commissioner Carusone moved to accept the Aquatic Facility Master Plan; seconded by Commissioner Blucher. Motion carried unanimously.

Recess: 3:15 p.m. - 3:39 p.m.

C. <u>Discussion, and possible action, regarding a letter to be sent to the US Census</u>

<u>Director Robert Groves</u> requesting a meeting regarding replacing the incorrect addressing of North Port residences. (Commissioner Garofalo)

Subsequent to discussion, the following actions were taken by the Commission: (1) there was a consensus for staff to draft a letter to be signed by the Commission Chair and sent to the U.S. Census Director Robert Groves requesting confirmation that the incorrect addressing of North Port residences will be counted for North Port correctly (City Planner Harrington to provide the letter); (2) there was a three to two (3-2) consensus to send a code red message to citizens stressing the importance of citizens participation in filling out their census forms. Commissioners Blucher and Treubert dissent due to the estimated cost for the code red of \$12,500 to \$13,000.00.

D. <u>Discussion, and possible action, regarding replacing Frontage Road with Sumter Boulevard on the Long Range MPO (Metropolitan Planning Organization).</u>
(Commissioner Garofalo)

Commissioner Garofalo provided an overview of the request to replace Frontage Road with Sumter Boulevard on the Long Range Metropolitan Planning Organization's project list.

Commissioner Carusone moved to approve replacing Frontage Road with Sumter Boulevard on the Long Range Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) project list; seconded by Commissioner Blucher. Motion carried unanimously.

E. <u>Discussion, and possible action, regarding moving of mail boxes on Bryant Street.</u> (Commissioner Blucher)

Commissioner Blucher provided an overview regarding a citizen's request to have mail boxes moved into the City's right of way on the opposite side of the street from where they are currently located.

After a request, there was no consensus given to send a letter to the Post Office to move the mailboxes. Commissioners Treubert, Jones, and Garofalo dissented.

There was a four to one (4-1) consensus to send a letter to the Post Office saying the mailboxes can be put in the right of way on either side of the street, but we do not have a preference. Commissioner Treubert dissented stating that this is a Post Office issue.

8. **PUBLIC COMMENT**: 3:56 p.m. – 3:58 p.m.

9. **COMMUNICATIONS:**

City Clerk Raimbeau: (1) there was a consensus for the Chair to sign a letter to be submitted with the Fire Rescue Application to the National League of Cities for an Award of Municipal Excellence for the Green Initiatives; (2) there was a consensus for the City Clerk to Schedule a Commission Joint Meeting with the Tamiami Trail Appearance Review Board (TTARB); (3) there was a consensus for the City Clerk to schedule a Commission Joint Meeting with the Transportation Advisory board (TAB; (4) there was a consensus for the City Clerk to prepare a Proclamation for the Sarasota County 2010/2011 Teacher of the Year.

<u>Commissioner Blucher:</u> - reported that he will be attending the Manasota Basin Board Meeting scheduled for Wednesday, April 14, 2010 to request that funding be continued for the Reverse Osmosis Plant.

Commissioner Jones: (1) there was a consensus for the North Port Commission to provide a chaperone and transportation for a student or Youth Advisory Board Member to be sent by the Florida Manasota League of Cities to the Florida League of Cities Conference in August; (2) reminded the Commission that the Boy's and Girl's Club's Prime Time Dinner and Auction is Saturday, April 17, 2010 and begins at 5:30 p.m.

City Manager: expressed his appreciation to employees participating in the NICE Program.

10. <u>ADJOURNMENT:</u>

Chair Garofalo adjourned the Commission Regular Meeting at 4:08 p.m.





Opportunities and Constraints Map



Canal and Creek System Master Plan Blockage in North/South Canal Connectivity









Overall Phasing Plan




