Problem Identification

The City of North Port is located at the southernmost border of Sarasota County, and is currently the most populated city within Sarasota County. The City of North Port is also known as one of the largest sized cities in the State of Florida as it is over 103 square miles in size. Furthermore, due to the geographic size of the city, there are many miles of roadways and trails that have not been developed. This has caused numerous locations and problems within the City of North Port due to the attraction of recreational use of All Terrain Vehicles (ATV?s). These undeveloped areas have become hot spots for youths as well as adults to come to ride their All Terrain Vehicles illegally, both on the roadways as well as on the undeveloped land. Some of the property intimately adjacent to the undeveloped roadways have been utilized so much by these recreational ATV operators that there is a network of trails throughout the area. Some of these trails extend through most of the city, and most the land being used is privately owned. Therefore, the ATV?s and their operators are causing damage to the private property.

The City of North Port adopted a City Code Regulation that prohibits the use of any off road vehicle within one-half of a mile from a residence or on undeveloped or vacant real property within the corporate limits of the City of North Port. However, without the proper equipment law enforcement efforts are hindered. Officers from the North Port Police Department have responded to the undeveloped areas that attract recreational use of ATV?s for serious crashes, parties, missing person searches, as well as shootings. All the above problems frequently involve ATV use either beforehand, during or after the incident. Many of the areas is utilized as a gathering point are only accessible by use of ATV?s, and searching for missing persons in these wooded areas is most effective when using ATV equipment.

In consideration with the above stated information North Port has become an attraction for ATV operators from the surrounding communities. Complaints are recorded that illustrate the illegal activity where ATV?s are operated on property within the City of North Port as well as on the roadways which is strictly prohibited by Florida State Statutes. When this illicit activity is taking place, it is common that other criminal activity is taking place as well. Without properly enforcing the laws of the State of Florida as well as Codes of the City of North Port, the illegal activity will likely increase. The complaints received from residents in the areas affected in conjunction with the victims of crimes necessities the need for additional resources to effectively enforce the applicable laws and protect life and property.

Project Summary (Scope of Work)

The City of North Port Police Department expects to broaden its law enforcement efforts within the undeveloped areas and trails to obtain voluntary compliance with the laws, and to continue to assist in any needed search and rescue operations during a report of a missing person. The efforts which will be utilized include but are not limited to

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increased ATV patrols, educating the public through social media, and utilization of all available law enforcement equipment that is available. With the approval of this grant, the North Port Police Department will be capable of added patrols within the affected areas with the goals of reducing incidents of crime and/or injury, and to assist in locating any missing person that is suspected to be missing within the undeveloped areas. Additionally, with the approval of this grant, there will be increased safety to the officers as well as to the public that are lawfully within the areas affected by the unlawful activity. The scope of work that is projected includes the added use of ATV patrols to effectively protect the life and property within the corporate boundaries of the City of North Port.
