Primary Goals of Fees

- Identify the costs and subsidy levels for City Services
- City knowingly subsidizes some of these services (law enforcement, for example)
- Some services provide benefit to individuals or groups using specific services
- City Commission decides how much of the cost is borne by the individual user of the service and how much is subsidized by general taxpayers through property tax levies

Primary Goals of Fees

- □ Revenues from fees are an appropriate means of achieving revenue enhancement
- □ Providing certain public services at cost can have numerous benefits to the City and its citizens:
 - All service users, including those exempt from property taxes, pay fees.
 - Non-residents, reducing the burden on City residents, pay fees.
 - Fees create a "rationing" of services and allow for the measurement of demand.
- □Allows for the shift from dependence on property and sales taxes for financing local services.

Principles Regarding Fees

 Categorizing services provided based on degree of community benefit received

Services that Provide General "Global" Benefit	Services that Provide Both "Global" Benefit and also a Specific Group or Individual Benefit	Services that Provide a Primary Benefit to an Individual or Group, with less "Global" Community Benefit
Police Patrol	 Recreation/ Community Services 	Building Permits
Park Maintenance	Youth Sports/ Family Activities	Planning & Zoning Approval

Concepts Regarding Fees

- □ Commonly accepted that fees are established at a level that will recover up to, and not more than, the cost of providing services.
- **□**Cost Recovery

Level of cost recovery is based on different service levels provided throughout the community.

☐ Fee Revenue is used to pay for operating expenditures within the specific fund

Business Tax Receipts is collected specifically for Economic Development operating costs

Building permits are restricted to the Building department to provide inspection services and other related operating costs

Conclusion

Motivation behind a cost of services/fee is for the City to:

- Maintain services at a level both accepted and effective for the community
- Decrease the amount of general tax subsidization in areas where the individual user of services should pay greater proportion of full cost
- Maintain control over the policy and management of these services
