Special Category Grants

About Special Category Grants

The Department of State, Division of historical Resources, provides state and federal funds for historic preservation. The purpose of this program is to provide funding to assist local, regional and state-wide efforts to preserve significant historic structures and archaeological sites, and promote knowledge and appreciation of the history of Florida. The purpose of Special Category grant funding is to assist major site-specific archaeological excavations, the major restoration or rehabilitation of historic buildings or structures, and major museum exhibits involving the development and presentation of information on the history of Florida. This program does not fund operational support for historic preservation organizations.

Special Category grants are awarded annually to assist in: acquisition of historic properties or archaeological sites; development activities such as restoration, rehabilitation, preservation, and structural analysis; stabilization of historic and archaeological properties; archaeological work such as field work and collection research, field investigation, analysis, and publication of findings; and museum exhibit projects such as those involving research, exhibit design, and fabrication and installation.

The Historic Preservation Grants Program utilizes an online grant system via which prospective applicants submit their applications. Applications from precious solicitation periods will also be available at this site as historical information (for viewing only). The new online system will launch April 1st, 2017.

An Applicant Organization may have no more than one (1) previously awarded grant from the Division (Special Category or small Matching) open at the time of application. Applications from Applicant Organizations with more than one open grant from the Division will not be accepted. Open grants include: Any previously submitted applications that are awaiting funding from the Florida Legislature; any applications that have been appropriated funding by the Florida Legislature but have not yet executed a Grant Award Agreement; and any funded grant that has not completed its Scope of Work or is still in its Grant Period.

Types of Projects

Types of historic preservation projects that can be funded include:

- Acquisition of historical resources such as archaeological sites or historic properties, or the moving of a historic building or structure that is under threat of demolition or destruction due to natural causes;
- Development projects such as building restoration and rehabilitation, stabilization of historic or archaeological properties, historic structure assessments, feasibility studies, emergency repairs, and preservation or management plans, among others;
- Archaeology projects involving major archaeological investigations such as research, fieldwork, and analysis and publication; and
- > Museum Exhibits which may include the design, fabrication, and installation of museum furniture and equipment, and the production of exhibit related media.

Eligibility

Eligible applicants include state agencies, universities, local governments and units of local governments, as well as non-profit organizations.

Application Limitations

Applicants may have no more than one (1) previously awarded Special Category Grant open at the time of application. Applications from applicants with more than one open Special Category Grant shall be declared ineligible and such applications shall be returned to the applicant.

An applicant from the same organization may not submit more than one Special Category Grant application under a single application deadline. State, county or city governments, or universities may submit single applications from more than one division or department during any grant cycle provided that those divisions or departments are separate and distinct budgetary units and provided that the applications do not address the same facility, project, or site.

Review Process

Special Category grant applications are evaluated at a public meeting in the fall by the Florida Historical Commission (FHC). The applications are evaluated, on a competitive basis, on historic significance, endangerment, appropriateness of the preservation treatment proposed, administrative capability of the organization, adequacy of technical and financial resources, educational potential, economic benefits, and public good resulting from the project.

Grant Award / Requirements for Match

Special Category grants provide assistance between \$50,000 and \$500,000. The grantee is required to provide a matching share of either \$50,000 or 50% of the award request, whichever is the higher amount. The match may be any combination of in-kind services, volunteer labor, donated materials and travel, plus cash-on-hand which must constitute a minimum of 25% of the total match.

REDI designated communities are eligible for a reduction of match (please see below).

Rural Economic Development Initiative (REDI)

Under the REDI initiative, certain rural or economically distressed counties or communities are designated as REDI qualified pursuant to Section 288.0656, *Florida Statutes* (http://www.leg.state.fl.us/Statutes/index.cfm?

App_mode=Display_Statute&Search_String=&URL=0200-0299/0288/Sections/0288.0656.html). This qualification permits a decrease in match for REDI applicants down to 10% of the grant award.

Substitute W9 Form

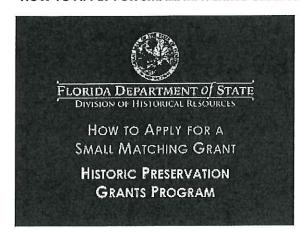
A Substitute W9 form will be requested of all projects except when organizations are a State Agency or State University.

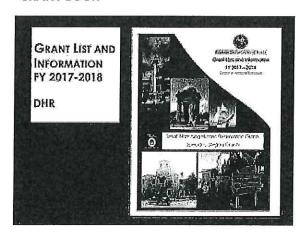
