

2019 Federal Legislative Priorities

- The City of North Port SUPPORTS legislation that promotes and funds housing opportunities for homeless veterans, affordable housing and workforce housing.
- The City of North Port **SUPPORTS** legislation that promotes and funds the strengthening of the mental health system, including suicide prevention, to help Americans receive the care and treatment they need.
- The City of North Port **SUPPORTS** legislation and funding for the opioid crisis, school safety and homelessness.
- The City of North Port **SUPPORTS** legislation that funds municipal infrastructure projects including expanding access to high speed broadband, transportation, water and utilities.
- The City of North Port **OPPOSES** any proposal to limit the value of the tax exemption for municipal bonds.
- The City of North Port SUPPORTS funding for grants and other programs available to municipalities, including health care services.
 - The City of North Port SUPPORTS funding for the widening of River Road and Price Boulevard.
 - The City of North Port SUPPORTS protection of clean water and water quality.
 - The City of North Port **SUPPORTS** funding for the I-75/Yorkshire Interchange.
 - The City of North Port **SUPPORTS** evaluating true accessibility to healthcare for veterans.
