ORDINANCE NO. 2020-22

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, CALLING FOR A REFERENDUM 4 5 QUESTION TO BE PLACED BEFORE THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF NORTH 6 PORT, FLORIDA AT THE NOVEMBER 3, 2020 GENERAL ELECTION; PROVIDING A 7 CHARTER REFERENDUM QUESTION DETERMINING WHETHER TO AMEND THE CITY 8 CHARTER TO REMOVE THE DESIGNATION OF THE DEPUTY CITY CLERK AS A CHARTER 9 OFFICER; PROVIDING FOR THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT; PROVIDING FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE IF THE PROPOSED 10 CHARTER AMENDMENT IS APPROVED; PROVIDING FOR THE FILING OF THE 11 12 ORDINANCE WITH THE SARASOTA COUNTY SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THE TEXT OF THE PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT; 13 14 PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF STATE IF THE PROPOSED 15 CHARTER AMENDMENT IS APPROVED; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR 16 SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

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WHEREAS, Section 166.031, Florida Statutes and Section 8.02(a) of the City Charter of the City of North Port, Florida ("City Charter") provide that the City Commission may, by ordinance, submit to the electors proposed amendments to the City Charter. Proposed amendments shall be placed to a vote of the electors at the next general election or special election called for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Review Advisory Board conducted a publicly-noticed meeting on October 30, 2019 to review this proposed change to the City Charter (at that time, this ordinance was numbered as 2019-05), and the City Commission considered the advisory board's input at first reading of this ordinance; and

- 25 **WHEREAS,** the City Commission finds that the City Charter should be amended to remove the 26 designation of the Deputy City Clerk position as a charter officer of the City of North Port; and
- WHEREAS, Section 5.05(c) of the City Charter provides that the Deputy City Clerk position shall not beabolished as a charter officer, except by referendum; and
- WHEREAS, the Sarasota County Supervisor of Elections advises that the next general election will occur on November 3, 2020. In order to obtain placement on the ballot for the general election, the Supervisor
- of Election has established a deadline of August 14, 2020 for the submission of referendum questions; and
- WHEREAS, this ordinance has been adopted by a vote of at least three (3) members of the City
 Commission; and

35 **WHEREAS**, the City Commission authorizes that the one (1) referendum question more particularly 36 described herein be placed on the November 3, 2020 ballot for consideration by the City's electors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT,
 FLORIDA:

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40 SECTION 1 – FINDINGS

- 41 1.01 The recitals outlined above are ratified and approved as true and correct, and are incorporated
 42 by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.
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44 SECTION 2 – PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENTS

- 45 2.01 Additions are shown as <u>underlined</u> and deletions as strikethrough. These editorial notations
 46 shall not appear in the codified text.
- Article V, Section 5.05 of the City Charter of the City of North Port, Florida, relating to organizational structure should be amended to read as follows:

49 **"Sec. 5.05**

"Sec. 5.05. - Organizational Structure

- (a) The City Commission shall, by ordinance adopted by unanimous vote, activate or deactivate departments as deemed necessary for the efficient administration and operation of City government. The following departments may not be deactivated except by referendum:
- 54 1. Police Department

2. Department of Finance

- 56 (b) The City Commission shall, by ordinance adopted by unanimous vote, create or 57 dissolve special districts as deemed necessary for the efficient administration and 58 operation of City government. The following districts may not be dissolved except 59 by ordinance after conducting a referendum question:
 - 1. Fire Rescue District
 - 2. Road and Drainage District
 - 3. Solid Waste District
- 63 (c) The following Charter officer positions shall not be abolished except by 64 referendum:
- 65 1. City Manager
- 66 2. City Clerk
- 67 3. Deputy City Clerk
- 68 4<u>3</u>. City Attorney
- 69 2.03 Article XI of the City Charter of the City of North Port, Florida should be repealed in its entirety.

70	"ARTICLE XI. – DEPUTY CITY CLERK		
71	Sec. 11.01 Appointment and qualifications.		
72	(a) The City Commission shall appoint the Deputy City Clerk by majority vote. The		
73	Deputy City Clerk shall be appointed on the basis of executive and administrative		
74	qualifications without regard to political affiliations of the individual. It shall not be		
75	required for the Deputy City Clerk to be a resident of the City at the time of		
76	appointment; however, the Deputy City Clerk shall be required to establish		
77	residency in the City within one (1) year of the appointment date and must		
78	maintain residency in the City while in the position, except as provided in		
79	Subsection (b).		
80	(b) If the Deputy City Clerk relocates out of the City but within Sarasota County due to		
81	a City-declared emergency and loss of residence due to emergency circumstances,		
82	the Deputy City Clerk will be given six (6) months to re-establish City residency. If		
83	the Deputy City Clerk is unable to re-establish City residency after the initial six (6)		
84	month period due to good cause, the Deputy City Clerk may be granted a one-time		
85	extension for an additional six (6) months by a majority vote of the City		
86	Commission. If the Deputy City Clerk is unable or unwilling to re-establish City		
87	residency by the deadline, the office of Deputy City Clerk will be declared vacant.		
88	At no time may the Deputy City Clerk relocate outside of Sarasota County without		
89	the office being declared vacant.		
90	Sec. 11.02 Employment contract.		
91	The City shall enter into a contract for employment with the Deputy City Clerk. The		
92	contract shall include the Deputy City Clerk's compensation as determined by the City		
93	Commission.		
94	Sec. 11.03 Removal.		
95	The Deputy City Clerk shall be removed from office for good cause by majority vote of		
96	the City Commission or by mutual consent of both parties.		
97	Sec. 11.04 Vacancy.		
98	(a) A vacancy shall be created upon the effective date of resignation, when the Deputy		
99	City Clerk fails to meet the residency requirement, dies, or is removed from office		
100	in any manner authorized by law.		
101	(b) In the event of a vacancy of the office of Deputy City Clerk for any reason		
102	whatsoever, the City Commission shall designate and appoint a properly qualified		
103	person to execute the functions of the office until such time as a new Deputy City		
104	Clerk is forthwith appointed by majority vote of the City Commission.		
105	Sec. 11.05. Powers and duties.		
106	The Deputy City Clerk shall be responsible to the City Commission for the proper		
107	administration of all affairs concerning the records of the City placed in the Deputy City		

- 108Clerk's charge under this Charter and as may be promulgated by ordinance or109resolution. The Deputy City Clerk shall:
- 110 (a) Carry out the duties of the City Clerk in the City Clerk's absence.
- 111(b) Make recommendations to the City Commission concerning the records and112clerical functions of the City.
- 113(c) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by general law, by this Charter, by114ordinance or resolution of the City, or by direction of the City Commission as a115whole.
- 116 Sec. 11.06. City clerk vacancy.
- 117When the City Clerk's office is vacant, the Deputy City Clerk shall carry out the duties of118the City Clerk until such time as a new City Clerk is appointed."
- 119 SECTION 3 REFERENDUM ELECTION CALLED

1203.01A referendum election is hereby ordered and called to be held throughout the City of North121Port, Florida on November 3, 2020. The referendum will be held in conjunction with the City of122North Port's general election for the purpose of submitting to the City's electors a referendum123question as to whether the current City Charter should be amended to remove the designation124of the Deputy City Clerk as a charter officer. The referendum question is more particularly set125forth below.

126 SECTION 4 – CONDUCT OF REFERENDUM ELECTION

- 4.01 The referendum election called by this ordinance shall be conducted in the manner prescribedin Chapters 100, 101, and 102, Florida Statutes.
- 4.02 The polling places, election officials, and hours of election for the general election shall be the
 same as those for the general election scheduled to be held within the City of North Port on
 November 3, 2020.

133 SECTION 5 – FORM OF BALLOT

1345.01The question pertaining to the adoption of the proposed amendment to the City Charter shall135be submitted to the qualified electors of the City in substantially the following form, and shall be136printed on the ballot:

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186 SECTION 7 – SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS TO POST COPY OF ORDINANCE AT EACH POLLING PLACE

187 7.01 The Supervisor of Elections shall conspicuously post a copy of this ordinance at each polling188 place during the hours that the polls are open to consider this referendum.

189 SECTION 8 – EFFECTIVENESS OF REFERENDUM RESULTS

- 190 8.01 Returns of the votes cast at the referendum shall be made as required by law.
- 1918.02If a majority of the votes cast for the referendum question is "YES Remove the Deputy City192Clerk as a charter officer," then the referendum question shall be approved and the proposed193City Charter amendment shall become effective as of 12:01 a.m. on the day following194certification of the referendum results.
- 195 8.03 If less than a majority of the votes cast for the referendum question is "YES Remove the
 196 Deputy City Clerk as a charter officer," then the referendum question shall be defeated, the
 197 adoption of the proposed City Charter amendment shall have failed and shall not be effective or
 198 operative, and the same shall be void and have no effect. The referendum question's defeat
 199 shall result in all provisions from the current City Charter remaining in full force and effect.

200 SECTION 9 – FILING WITH THE SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS

9.01 Upon this ordinance becoming effective, the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy
 of this ordinance with the Supervisor of Elections for Sarasota County, Florida, and is hereby
 authorized to take all appropriate actions necessary to carry into effect and accomplish the
 electoral provisions of this ordinance.

205 SECTION 10 – FILING WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF STATE

20610.01If the City's electors approve the referendum question and the proposed City Charter207amendment provided for herein, the City Clerk is hereby directed to file the City Charter208amendment with the Florida Department of State in accordance with Section 166.031(2), Florida209Statutes.

210 SECTION 11 – CONFLICTS

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- 11.01 In the event of any conflicts between the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance,
 the provisions of this ordinance shall prevail to the extent of such conflict.

214 SECTION 12 - SEVERABILITY

12.01 If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phase, or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

219 SECTION 13 - EFFECTIVE DATE

13.01 This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption by the City Commission of the City
 of North Port, Florida. If the City's qualified electors approve the proposed City Charter
 amendment by referendum approval, the City Charter amendment shall become effective as
 specifically provided for in Section 8 above.
