

Call to Artists - City of North Port, Florida

Project: "Three Graces" Rock Sculpture
Location: Three Graces Fountain, North Port

Budget: \$20,000? (TBD)

"Three Graces Rock Sculpture" Project Brief:

Artists are invited to submit work – existing or conceptual – who are working in any three-dimensional medium. The sculpture must include work with locally or easily sourced rocks provided by local citizens, represent contemporary or historical North Port history, or be representative of indigenous art and culture. The final artwork piece must also be easily visible and recognizable from passing vehicles.

North Port has a subtropical climate that is hot and humid with intense sun and seasonal heavy rains and hurricane-force winds. Avoiding potential problems such as deteriorating rust and fading should be considered. Proposals need to include materials and designs that are durable enough to last through potentially severe and hazardous Florida weather, including tropical activity and high winds over a long course of time, without extensive maintenance. Final installations must meet all current applicable codes. Recommended materials include stone, stainless steel, concrete, or the like which is both UV and rust-resistant and maintenance free.

Artwork should be constructed to reasonably discourage theft and vandalism and must take into consideration the ground surrounding the piece. Include plans for nighttime lighting. The artist will be responsible for any repairs needed due to fabrication defects or reasonable wear and tear of the object in a public location.

While artistic quality is very important, works will be reviewed for durability, safety, and appropriateness to the site. Artwork must be structurally sound and able to withstand an outdoor environment in a largely unsupervised area that is not protected from weather or curious viewers.

Budget:

The proposed artwork(s) is/are intended to be installed permanently. The \$20,000 budget is a "project budget" and is used for all related costs to the project, including the artist's stipend, fabrication, and delivery to North Port, FL. The work of art will be owned by the City of North Port, North Port, FL.

Selection Criteria:

Participating artists must have reached a certain level of expertise and recognition in their medium. Their CV/resume should illustrate and include that the artist has completed other public commissions on a similar scale.

The City of North Port Arts Advisory Board will narrow submissions down to three finalists for presentation to the City Commission for final selection.

2) CV/Resume

Submit an *abbreviated* CV/Resume with project-related relevant information. Format needs to comply with one-inch margins, no less than 10pt font, and minimum single-spaced, no more than the front side of one page. Please include email and phone contact.

3) Examples of Work

5-15 digital images of relevant work created in the last seven years including an Image Identification Sheet, which shall describe the submitted images, and be clearly labeled with a project number, project name, For each image, the artist shall include a thumbnail of image, image number, title of work, date of work, medium of work, dimensions of work, price of work or amount of commission, and indication of artwork's availability for purchase (if applicable). Artist name, artist address, artist phone number, and artist email.

4) Your project

Upload a detailed image(s) and/or sketch/digital rendering of your project with actual dimensions indicated and plans for placement. Describe materials and their durability. Explanation of maintenance requirements and estimated maintenance expense should be included, as well.

5) Budget

Please include a detailed breakdown of project estimate, including projected cost of installation as well as the following:

· Artwork production materials

- Contractor service fees
- Workshop materials
- Equipment rentals
- Insurance
- Permits
- 2-year maintenance costs
