ORDINANCE NO. 2023-34

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, REPEALING AND REPLACING SECTION 74-84 AND 74-93 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, RELATING TO PARKING VIOLATIONS; CLARIFYING THE **PENALTIES** AND **PROCEDURES CONTESTING** FOR VIOLATION TICKET; PROHIBITING PARKING FOR STORAGE PURPOSES IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY IN IDENTIFIED ZONING DISTRICTS AND ALONG TAMIAMI TRAIL; AND UPDATING STATUTORY REFERENCES RELATED TO PARKING SPACES FOR DISABLED PERSONS; BY AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, SECTION 74-84 AND SECTIONS 74-92 THROUGH 74-94; AND REPEALING CERTAIN FEES RELATED TO PARKING VIOLATIONS BY AMENDING APPENDIX A, SECTION F, POLICE FEES; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR **CONFLICTS: PROVIDING SEVERABILITY: PROVIDING** FOR CODIFICATION: PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance

This proposed ordinance would (1) clarify the penalties and procedures for contesting a parking violation ticket, (2) prohibit parking for storage purposes in the public right-of-way in identified zoning districts and along Tamiami Trail, and (3) update statutory references related to parking spaces for disabled persons. The public purpose of this proposed ordinance is to help ensure compliance with the parking codes of the City of North Port, Florida.
