11	58, 59, 60, and 61, and replacing those chapters with Chapters 1 through 4 and 6, and Appendices; and

41	to investigate facts, or ascertain the existence of facts, hold hearings, weigh evidence, and
42	draw conclusions from such facts, as a basis for their official action, and to exercise discretion
43	of a judicial nature and any other decision involving the implementation, rather than
44	formation, of city policy. Quasi-judicial matters include, but may not necessarily be limited to
45	the following:
