### **ORDINANCE NO. 2024-18**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF THE CITY OF NORTH PORT, FLORIDA, TO UPDATE REFERENCES FOR CONSISTENCY WITH THE UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE; AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE IV., DIVISION 1. – HEARING OFFICERS; AMENDING CHAPTER 4 – BOARDS AND COMMITTEES, TO ADDRESS COMMISSION LIAISONS AND THE ART ADVISORY BOARD; AMENDING CHAPTER 22, ARTICLE II. – FERTILIZER AND LANDSCAPE MANAGEMENT; AMENDING CHAPTER 59, SECTION 59-1 – PARKING AND STORAGE OF CERTAIN VEHICLES ON RESIDENTIAL LOTS; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

#### **1. Summary of the proposed ordinance**

The proposed ordinance updates references in Chapters 2, 4, 22 and 59 of the Code of the City of North Port, Florida ("City Code") are no longer accurate and do not align with the Unified Land Development Code ("ULDC"), and achieve consistency between the City Code and the ULDC.

The public purpose of this proposed ordinance is to serve the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the citizens of the City of North Port, Florida.

#### **2. Estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City, if any, including:**
